4. DAY SCHEDULE

- If a student is late for school or stays late after school, Parents must know the reason for their stay, especially for primary students. Parents should know exactly where, when, and who they are with to avoid any tragic event from occurring. The School Office will notify Parents of any circumstances that need to be resumed. If the Parents pick up the child after 5:30 pm. Every day, the School will charge an extra-hour care fee of 150,000 VND/hour. If a student does not participate in any activities after school, the School will be exempted from the responsibility of supervising the students after school.

Parents/Guardians entering the School during the hours of 8:15 am to 3:30 pm need to make an appointment with the School Office.

1. HEALTH REPORT

Student health records are always completed before the student is admitted and updated for the next academic year. Any related medical information such as illness, vaccination schedule or other information, must be provided to the School Health Department. Teachers or staff involved in the health of the student will be notified and information about the student's health will be kept confidential. Parents will receive forms: Admission Form and Health Report.

Please complete the form and return it to the School.

2. TREATED DAILY

If students need to take antibiotics during the day, Parents have to create a drug information form on the dosage, the period of use, and other instructions on Parent Portal SPS 360 and bring medicines along when taking students to school. The Medical Department will be responsible for managing, storing all medicines securely, properly, as well as monitoring and supporting students when taking medicines according to the prescription information provided by Parents.

Notes:

- If there are any undesirable reactions or emergencies occurring while your child is taking the medication, the School will immediately notify the Parents and provide medical support if necessary.
- If the disease is mild, antibiotics or other medicines should be given by Parents to consume before or after school.
- Please ensure that students do not carry any other drugs during their stay at school; as well as
 during their extracurricular activities. In special cases, please contact the School's medical staff for
 assistance.

3. DRUG USE IN CASE OF EMERGENCY

With parental permission, students may use over-the-counter medications for the following illnesses at school: headaches, menstrual cramps, sore throats, etc. If you have the same symptom more than three times a month, you will receive a thorough medical evaluation.

4. DISEASES AND ACCIDENTS

4.1. DISEASES

When sick or injured during school hours, students will be referred to the School's medical department for prompt treatment. If the incident is serious, they may be taken to the emergency room at the nearest hospital. The costs for such services will be paid by the Parents/Guardians.

In case of necessity, the student will be sent home, at which time the School will contact the Parents/Guardians in advance to arrange for student pick-up.

Exceptionally, the administration may have other options.

If a student has to be absent for health reasons, Parents will need to provide the relevant medical records to the administration. When they are sick, they are not allowed to leave school without contacting the health department.

5. RETURN TO SCHOOL AFTER ILLNESS

Please inform the School of infectious diseases such as chicken pox, diarrhea from intestinal infection, rheumatism, tuberculosis, impetigo, meningitis, mononucleosis/glandular inflammation or any other case of inflammation before they return to school. Students who have these conditions need to be informed by a doctor about their non-communicable status, or what the School needs to keep in mind. When they are ready to return to school, Parents need to update a written notice from their doctor in the Absence Letter created on Parent Portal SPS 360.

Students in Year 7 need to prepare personal computers and math learning tools.

For Bilingual Program, students will be taught both English and Vietnamese language in the teaching process. Students are required to use English in areas where English is required and in New South Wales curriculum classrooms.

Closing ceremony

IX. EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES



1. House System

SISS House System will be officially introduced and implemented in the new academic year 2023 - 2024 for primary and secondary schools, with many competitions in academics, sports, arts and social engagement.

Students have opportunities to earn achievement points for themselves and their teams through activities and competitions taking place at school. The House System aims at implementing school rules and regulations, encouraging students to participate in extracurricular activities related to sports and cultures, and promoting their leadership skills.

Students are assigned to their houses in a random manner. The allocation process can take into consideration students' needs in social and emotional skills to ensure appropriate instruction for all students within a House.

The SISS House System consists of 4 symbols based on Greek Mythology:



Zeus

The symbol of Strength and Justice



Apollo

The symbol of Artistic Beauty



Asclepius

The symbol of Compassion



Athena

The symbol of Wisdom

Combining students from all Years in one House allows them to meet and work with their new peers. Younger students feel comfortable going up to the older grades and older students improve their relationships with younger students.

The House System will bring big changes in after-school activities, encourage connection and healthy competition to grow together in a friendly, collaborative learning community.

2. Practical Learning Program and Experiential Activities

During the academic year, students experience 2 types of extracurricular activities, including subject-related experiential activities (mandatory) and the practical learning program (optional).

The Experiential Activities include day trips provided to students free of charge. The School always creates various opportunities and beneficial activities for students through external field trips. Each field trip is related to a specific subject theme and students are required to submit assignments or reflections after each trip.

Students are required to maintain a serious attitude and adhere to the School's regulations and policies when participating in experiential activities and field trips. Students are expected to dress appropriately for the learning environment. In special cases, students will receive specific announcements regarding dress codes.

Regarding the practical learning program, Parents will be informed two months in advance, which is anticipated to be held during winter break week or the final week before the completion of the academic year. These are optional programs and require a fee. The paid field trip fee is non-refundable for any reason.

3. Spirit Day

The School will organize several Spirit Day activities for SISS community, for example:

These events can only be successfully implemented with the unity of all students in the SISS community. These events can only be achieved with the unity of all SISS community students. For each student who wears attire to school with the above meaning, the School will deduct 10,000 VND per student for charity.

4. After-school activities

After school, the School regularly organizes various activities covering academics, sports, arts and education for the following purposes:

- Create various beneficial activities to expand students' knowledge.
- Create a fun, enjoyable environment for students to play and relax after school.
- Enhance community awareness and consciousness.
- Enhance community engagement.
- Develop leadership skills.
- Foster teamwork skills.

- Foster the sense of responsibility toward themselves and the community.
- Nurture Creativity.
- Preserve cultural heritage through traditional artistic activities.

The activities will be implemented in a diverse range, including:



Clubs

Clubs are organized twice a week with 20 different activities. The duration of each club lasts 25 sessions per academic year. Students can choose to participate in 02 clubs per year. Parents are kindly requested to explore the club introduction and regulation here.



Talents Development Academy

In the academic year 2023 - 2024, students who show talent after being assessed for their abilities will be nurtured, reviewed, and supported to participate in both domestic and international academic, talent, and science and technology competitions.

The Talents Development Academy (TDA) will accept registrations from students at the beginning of each semester. Parents can register through the Parent Portal. Information about the training fields and instructions on how to register will be sent to Parents prior to the registration opening date.



Sign up early to make reservation

First come first serve, the School only gives priority for early sign-ups because the size class is limited. Successful candidates will be confirmed by text. The rest will be on the waiting list.



Tutoring class

Based on the academic results of the previous academic year for the existing students and the entrance test results for the new students, the School will arrange tutoring classes for students who require additional support for their academic subjects.

Notifications regarding participation in these classes will be sent to Parents. For students who are not included in the assigned class list, Parents can register online through the Parent Portal if their child has a need for tutoring. The registration process can also include selecting the preferred club activity schedule.



Disciplined participation

The School will reject disciplinary students who have disciplinary problems during the course of their activities. Parents will be notified of student misbehavior. Students who leave earlier or are absent more than three times will be terminated from class.



Cancellation of after-school activities

In the event of any cancellation of afterschool activities, the School will immediately notify the Parents of primary and secondary students. For students in high school level, the School will communicate the information through their respective homeroom teachers.
